Hillcrest Christian College, with about 1,350 students from Kindergarten to Year 12, is a learning environment that strives to challenge, inspire and maximise every student's potential.

## Why did the school choose LiteracyPlanet?

Named as one of *The Educator* magazine's Innovative Schools for 2017, Hillcrest Christian College provides students with an innovative and responsible 21st Century digital learning environment.

Teachers for the Junior Learning Community (JLC), Prep to Year 6, were looking for a digital method of engaging

"I love LiteracyPlanet. We use it for customised group words that complement our spelling program," says Liz Snowdon, Year 4 Lead Teacher.

Another favourite is LiteracyPlanet's annual Word Mania competition, when students can flex their word-building skills to try and win prizes for the school.

Aspects of the program that teachers value the most include being able to easily differentiate and the genuine enjoyment students find in using it.
